2024 King and the Klan: A Visual Experience

Filmmaker with Dr. Jason Miller, NC State University

Using never-before-seen film footage from 1966, this digital installation and introductory film contextualizes Martin Luther King, Jr.'s only appearance at NC State University within the framework of an 1,800 person KKK rally in downtown Raleigh. Seeing color film of this intentionally timed march informs why few today in the NC State Community remember or memorialize Dr. King's appearance at Reynolds Coliseum, and serves as a stark reminder that the violence, anger, and hatred surrounding him still informs our everyday lives. 600+ students in HSS 201 (Critical Thinking in American Life) are now viewing the film and exhibit before reading "Letter from Birmingham Jail" as part of their coursework.

2023 Restoring Rose Hill: A Short Film

Filmmaker & Producer, NC State University

This short film details Rose Hill Plantation in Union, South Carolina, an estate with a complex history including wealth, slavery, and its role in the Confederacy. Now undergoing restoration to recognize and honor the lives and legacies of all people those associated with the site, the film provides a compelling look into Rose Hill's effort to reckon with its past and promote understanding of its historical significance.
